## What is an industry placement?

An industry placement (or work placement) is a supervised period of work with an employer that specialises in your chosen sector of work. It gives you the opportunity to experience the world of work and find out what a specific role involves. Work placements are a great way to develop your skills and build your experience.

#### What are the key benefits?

- Gain first-hand experience of an industry

#### How to find a placement

- 1. Make a list of ideas and businesses you would like to contact
- 2. Use the internet to research the businesses or ask family, friends and tutors for help
- 3. Once you have a shortlist, send an email, call them, or pop in and visit the company

If you don't hear back from an employer make sure you follow it up with a telephone call. Finding your own placement shows employers that you are confident and that you are committed to gaining experience.

# Industry Placements

### So I have found a placement, what happens now?

- 1. Firstly, gather the following information together:
  - Business name and address of the work placement provider
  - Name of the person in charge of your placement
  - Contact email address
  - Start and end dates of your placement
  - Contact telephone number
  - Hours worked on each day of your placement
  - Details of the role/duties that you'll be undertaking
- 2. Fill out a work placement form and ensure the parent/guardian consent form is also completed which you can find on your ezone/home page. Ask your tutor for support if required.
- 3. The completed form will automatically notify the work placement team
- 4. The work placement team will make contact with your employer to ensure that the relevant health and safety proceedures are in place
- 5. You will be notified when your placement is ready to go ahead!
